As all other mobile or PC applications also Locus Map needs testing and feedback before releasing a new version with new functions and features. Therefore there are so called Beta versions pre-released on which these new functions and features are tested by developers and helpful users as well. **These Beta versions are public and they are free.**

TTS files translations

TTS (Text To Speech) files are used for voice navigation or training voice notifications. The main problem of TTS is **correct spelling of numbers**. To make it work at 100% Menion created a system where all texts are stored in text files in usable format prepared for reading.

In English it's not so bad, there are only *one/first*, but for example in Czech, there are four possibilities *jeden/jednu/první/prvním*. So this file may contain arrays names numbers_NX where X is 1 - 5. You

may then use these numbers in action texts.

The format of this file is JSON. It's a little bit complicated to write but much easier to read and work with.

How to help with translation?

- TTS files are stored on a [shared Google Drive](#)
- all changes Menion does are stored in the README file so read it once a time to check if there is something new
- recommended way to modify the files is in [Google Docs](#): tap on *"Tools"* > *"Manage apps"* > *"Connect more apps"* > *"Anyfile Notepad"*! It allows editing these TTS files directly on web and mainly, it has very good JSON syntax highlight and error reports (e.g. incorrect syntax).
